General Rules and Regulations

ADMISSION

Admission to the school will be open to all, irrespective of caste, creed and nationality. Admission to LKG will be on first come first served basis. Preference will be given to members of Kadaplamattom Parish. Admission to higher classes will be on the basis of merit and availability of seats. A written test and an interview will be conducted for assessing the merit of the student.

A student desirous of getting admission should apply in the prescribed application form. The birth certificate and aadhar number of the student should be produced at the time of admission.

The principal reserves the right to reject admission to any student without assigning reasons.

School Time: The school time is from 9.20 am to 3.20 pm. Students must be in their classrooms by 9.15 am. Those who reach the school early are expected to sit in their respective classrooms, learning their lessons in silence.

Students should speak only English in the class room and in the school campus.

Textbooks and notebooks according to the time table of the day must be brought to the class. Any default in this matter, will be informed to the parents through the daily reports in this handbook. No other books, periodicals or comics shall be brought to the school. Parents should go through this hand-book daily.

Students should not wear gold ornaments or bring other valuable articles to the school. The school authorities will not be responsible for the loss of such articles. Students are strictly banned from bringing mobile phones and other electronic gadgets like i-pad, personal stereos, CDs, pendrives, pagers etc. Parents are instructed to take special care of this. Such articles, if found with students, will not be returned.

Promotion to higher classes will be based on the overall performance in various tests and examinations. It is, therefore, essential that students sit for all the examinations.

No student will be allowed to appear for the terminal or final examination unless all the fees are paid till date.

Students will not be allowed to go home during class hours even if some urgent need arises, unless a duly authorised person comes to take him / her.

DISCIPLINE: Students must be self-disciplined and well-behaved, and must behave respectfully to the members of the staff and other elders. They should wish the teachers and other respectable persons "Good morning" or "Good afternoon" as the case may be. They should also greet one another. Refined manners, obedience, neatness in person and dress, punctuality, and above all honesty are expected from the students.

The school will be working regularly on all days except Saturdays and Sundays, other holidays noted in the school calendar, and the days suddenly declared holidays by the government.

A Whatsapp group of parents for each class will be formed for easy and effective communication with the class teachers as admins. The group will be for communication between the school and the parents. Only school related messages should be posted in the group. Greetings and good mornings must be avoided.

PROTECTION OF WOMEN

For the protection of teachers and students from sexual harrassment of any sort, we have a Women's Grievance Redressal Cell. The following teachers are its members.

If anybody has any such grievance she must immediately report it to the committee members or to the principal.

SCHOOL UNIFORM:

The school will have only one uniform.

Boys: (1) Blue and white striped shirt with half sleeves and one pocket. Navyblue shorts with side pockets and loops at the side for the school belt. Black shoes with navy blue socks, navy blue tie, navy blue and white striped belt.

Boys from Std. V should wear pants instead of shorts.

Girls: (1) Blue and white striped shirt with half sleeves and shirt collar. Navy blue box pleated pinafore of knee length with loops at the side for the school belt. Black shoes with navy blue socks, navy blue tie, navy blue and white striped belt, white bush, hair band.

Girls from Std. V should wear pants and overcoat.

Low waist pants are strictly prohibited.

School Badge:

While in the school and enroute to the school all students should wear school identity card.

Conveyance:

School buses are available for commuting the students to the school and back home. Parents who wish to send their children by the school bus must inform the Principal in advance. Bus fee should be paid in advance before the 10th of every month, failing which fine will be charged. Fee once paid will not be refunded. The bus fees will be decided by the management in accordance with the change in fuel prices. Students should come to the boarding point on time, and are expected to behave well while travelling. Parents who use other modes of conveyance must ensure that their wards reach the school on time.

FEES

- 1. Admission fee is to be paid at the time of admission.
- 2. There are two options for payment of tuition fees and other fees which include special fee, computer fee, examination fee, sports and games fee and digi-class fee.
 - a) Pay the full amount at the beginning of the academic year.
 - b) Pay in three instalments (quarterly June, September & November) Tuition fees shall be paid as e-fee at Federal Bank, Kadaplamattom branch. For this each student will be given a unique identification number which should be collected from the school.
- 3. All fees should be paid before the 10th of the first month of each quarter. Bus fare is to be paid every month before the 10th of each month.
- 4. A fine of Rs. 100/- will be levied after the dates fixed for the payment of the tuition fee and bus fare till the last working day of that month.

PARENTAL CO-OPERATION

- 1. Fill up the details given on page 2 of the Handbook, attested with your signature.
- 2. Parents must ensure that their child comes to the school neatly dressed in the prescribed school uniform, on all working days.

- 3. The school expects the parents to supervise the studies of their children and to take a keen interest in their day-to-day needs.
- 4. Parents must see that students selected for school programmes including competitions, attend practice/ rehearsal sessions regularly and report for the events on time.
- 5. Refrain from criticising the teachers or the school in the presence of your children. If you have any such grievance, meet the principal personally. Sending anonymous letters serve no purpose.
- 6. Parents should attend the Parent-Teacher meetings arranged by the school authorities to discuss the progress of their children in their studies and other aspects of school life. Inability to attend any such meeting should be informed in advance.
- 7. Parents are not allowed to meet the teachers during class hours. They can meet them either before the class or after the classes or during lunch break.
- 8. Parents are not allowed to see the students during class hours without the permission of the Principal.
- 9. Parents should ensure that their children bring the School Hand Book to the school everyday. They should also go through it daily and counter-sign any remark written by the teachers.
- 10. If any student requires casual leave the parents must fill the leave record form giving reason and duly signed by them.
- 11. Entrusting a pupil to the school implies that parents agree to stand by the rules and regulations of the school and they should see that the children also abide by school regulations.

- 12. Parents must see that the school fees and bus fare are paid on the due dates mentionend in the hand book.
- 13. The management reserves the right to change the dates fixed for examinations and other activities, if need arises.
- 14. Speaking English is compulsory in the campus and in the school bus. No student shall leave the school premises during school time without the permission of the Principal. Students themselves will be responsible for the safe custody of their belongings. The school authorities will not be responsible for the loss of articles of the students and for any injury that might happen accidently. Any damage done to the school property should be immediately reported to the Principal and will have to be made good.
- 15. The school introduces a grading system of students. The teachers will grade the students on the basis of their behaviour and attitude. They will get positive points if their behaviour is exemplary and conducive to good manners. They will be awarded negative points if their behaviour is against accepted standards. Particulars of positive behaviour patterns and negative behaviour patterns are given on page 96-97.

Cocurricular / Extra Curricular Activities

The school offers special training in Karate, Yoga, Abacus, Dance, Music and Painting. Painting will be compulsory for all. Apart from this every student has to take part in at least one co-curricular activity which will be conducted on Thursdays. As training is imparted by external faculty students are required to pay extra fee for that in two equal instalments.

Attendance at official functions like school anniversary, sports day and other celebrations will be compulsory. The required fees have to be paid.

Students may offer only sweets to their teachers and other students on their birthdays. Teachers may be wished on their birthdays. No other celebrations are permitted.

LEAVE RULES

- 1. Absence on the re-opening day is not allowed. As regular attendance is an important element for successful school work, no student should absent himself/herself from class without sufficient reasons.
- 2. Parents/Guardians must state clearly the reason for the absence. Failure to do so invalidates the application and renders the student liable to punishment.
- 3. Leave of absence must be obtained from the Class teacher, attested in the 'Leave Record' of the Handbook.
- 4. No student shall leave the school premises during the school hours or recess without the previous permission of the Principal.
- 5. Normally half-day leave will not be granted to students. Once they come to school, they have to be present the whole day. They are not allowed to go out of the school campus during school hours, including recess time.
- 6. In case of serious illness, the Principal must be informed within three days with a Doctor's certificate accompanied by the leave application from the parent / guardian.
- 7. Those who return to school after absenting themselves without prior permission, shall not enter the class without the leave notes countersigned by the Principal.
- 8. Students suffering from contageous or infectious diseases will not be permitted to attend the school. The Principal should be informed before the student attends the class after recovery from such diseases.
- 9. Unauthorised absence for more than 15 days renders a student liable to be removed from the rolls and the usual

admission fee will be charged if he/she is to be readmitted.

10. No student who comes late shall enter the class without obtaining the signature of the Class teacher in the 'Late Coming Record' sheet of the handbook.

LIBRARY

We have a good library comprising books in all subjects as also for general reading to inculcate reading habit in students. So also English and Malayalam dailies and good magazines are provided. Everyone should see that the periodicals are kept in their proper places after reading. Students should enter the names of the books they have read in the pages provided in the diary. At the end of the session, he/she gets the signature of the Teacher-in-charge.

LIBRARY RULES

- 1. Library will remain open from 9.00 am to 4.00 pm
- 2. Pupils can borrow one book at a time and should return within 7 days.
- 3. The librarian may call for the book at any time even before the date of return.
- If the book is not returned on the due date, a fine of Rs. 5/- per day may be levied. No fine will be charged for books overdue if a letter can be produced showing the borrower has been absent for valid reasons.
- 5. Sub-lending of the books is not allowed under any circumstance.
- 6. Any marking, underlining or annotating on books is strictly forbidden, otherwise a fine will be levied.
- 7. Reference books cannot be borrowed or taken out of the library.
- 8. While taking a new book out, any defect or damage in it must be brought to the notice of the Librarian and class teacher immediately. Any additional damage or loss of the book will have to be made good. Books lost will

have to be replaced by the student or he will have to pay double the cost of it.

9. Students are not permitted to bring their bags to the library. Silence and orderliness must be observed in the library.

COMPUTER LAB RULES

- 1. Take off your shoes before entering the lab.
- 2. Unless and until need be, do not boot any system in the computer.
- 3. Do not bring any diskette / CD / Floppy from outside without the permission of the Teacher.
- 4. Don't move or shift the components or systems from their position.
- 5. Do not play with computer peripheral and wire.
- 6. Do not play with keyboard. Press any key softly.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

In order to impart a healthy competitive spirit among students, to learn group work dynamics and to develop leadership qualities all competitions will be done under House System. All students will belong to one or the other House. Points are awarded to each House based on their performance and at the end of the year the best House is awarded a Rolling Trophy.

1. The competition in various items are conducted in four categories on the basis of the class which a student belongs to.

Category IV : Class VIII, IX, X

2. One student shall participate in a maximum of five

single items and two group items only. Of the single items only three shall be stage items.

3. Points: Individual Items : I (5), II (3), III (1)

Group Items : I (10), II (7), III (4)

- 4. General and group items will not be considered for individual awards.
- 5. Individual awards will be given in Arts and Sports separately.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

As per the new examination scheme of CBSE, the academic year will have two terms. The first term will be from June to October and the second from November to March. This division is applicable to class I to VIII. There will be one mid term test (periodic test) and half-yearly examination in term one and post mid term (periodic) test and annual examination in term two.

The marks allotment and the division of the syllabi will be as explained below.

The Periodic test will be out of 40 marks and the annual Examination will be out of 80 marks. 10 marks will be for periodic assessment; 5 marks for notebook submission and 5 marks for subject enrichment activity.

Students must keep the Note Books tidy and complete in all respects. At the end of the term they will submit them to the respective subject teachers.

Subject Enrichment Activities:

There will be subject specific activities carried out through out the term, enhancing the understanding and skills of the students. They will be evaluated at the end of each term. These activities will be recorded internally by respective subject Teachers.

Grading Scale for scholastic areas:

Co -Scholastic Activities (Classes I to VIII)

Co-Scholastic activities will be conducted as per the instruction from CBSE

Health and Physical Education

Students will be assessed on a three point scale (A = Outstanding, B = Very Good and C = Fair) in each term.

Students will also be assessed for discipline in the same format. Attendance, commitment to studies, tidiness, respect for rules and regulations, attitude towards society and nation will be the assessment parameters.

Classess IX and X

For classess IX and X there will be three periodic tests, a pre-board Exam (Model Exam) and the Annual Exam. (In the case of class X it will be the Board Exam). The best of the two periodic tests will be taken for Internal Assessment. Five marks are for Notebooks and Five marks for subject enrichment activities. Grades will be awarded on an 8 point scale, but those who score below 33% will be treated as failed.

In the co-scholastic domain assessment will be on a five point scale (A to E) Tentative dates of the examination for all classess are

First Mid term (P.T.1)	- July 22 to July 30
Term I (Half Yearly)	- October 9 to October 19.
Second Mid term(P.T.2)	- January 6 to January 14
Annual Exam	- March 16 to 27

If there is any change in the examination dates, the same will be intimated to the students through the respective columns in this hand book (pp: 32-41)
